At home

At home

Maths

We are learning about the properties of four-sided shapes, including square and rectangles. We will be looking for them in our environment and creating our own shape pictures. We are also thinking about positional language (such as between, in, on next to) and will be moving objects into different positions.

At home

Try to use this language in normal conversations, reinforcing where things are around the house. Reinforce the language when your child is playing, for example, can you put the blue block on top of the red one?
